




Headwaters Real Estate Recap: SEPTEMBER 2016

THE FALL MARKET IS UPON US, and the headwaters market area of Orangeville, Dufferin, Caledon and Erin continues the trend of low inventory and strong sales resulting in rising average prices. Orangeville inventory is extremely low compared to past years. As of today, Orangeville has a *mere 18* freehold listings available without conditional offers on them. Compare that to October of 2014, where active buyers had a choice of 177 homes on the market. In the month of September, average sale to list ratio in Orangeville was 101%; a clear indication that many sales were multiple offer scenarios. When a home sells with 4 buyers bidding on a house, there are 3 left still ready to pounce on the next decent available listing. Will this trend in the Headwaters continue?
