The parade starts at the Legion at 10:30 a.m. and the service at the cenotaph in Alexandra Park is set for 11 a.m. Every year the Legion also conducts a "sunset service" in Forest Lawn Cemetery at the monument at 2 p.m. and then members proceed to drop off poppies at some gravesites.
