## Remembrance Day...





Attending Remembrance Day ceremonies on November 11th is a well known way to honour the men and women who served Canada in times of war, military conflict and peace. There are many other ways, throughout the year, to remember the sacrifices and achievements of the one and a half million brave Canadians who served, and continue to serve, our country at home and abroad, and the more than 118,000 men and women who died so that we may live in peace and freedom today. Taking an active role to remember these people is one way to say "thank you."

### Ways to be Active:



- Wear a poppy.
- Lay a wreath at the cenotaph
- Plant poppies, tulips, a tree or an entire garden of remembrance.
- Attend a Remembrance Day ceremony. To find a ceremony visit our online calendar of events, or use the Veterans Matter mobile app, available all year.
- Pause for two minutes of silence at 11:00 a.m. on November 11.
- Plan and participate a commemorative ceremony at school or with a community group.
- Have your children, grand children participate in the Royal Canadian Legion Annual Literary and Poster Contest that is open to all Canadian school children.
- Visit your local cemetery and pay respect to a Veteran's grave.

## Facts on Remembrance Day:

-  Remembrance Day was first observed in 1919 throughout the British Commonwealth. It was originally called "Armistice Day" to commemorate armistice agreement that ended the First World War on Monday November 11 1918 at 11 am – on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month.
-  Every year on November 11, Canadians pause in a moment of silence to honour and remember the men and women who have served, and continue to serve Canada during times of war, conflict and peace. We remember the more than 2,300,000 Canadians who have served throughout our nation's history and the more than 118,000 who made the ultimate sacrifice.
-  The poppy is the symbol of Remembrance Day. Replica poppies are sold by the Royal Canadian Legion to provide assistance to Veterans.
-  The national ceremony is held at the National War Memorial in Ottawa. The Governor General of Canada presides over the ceremony. It is also attended by the Prime Minister, other government officials, representatives of Veterans' organizations, diplomatic representatives, other dignitaries, Veterans as well as the general public.

## Town of Orangeville Remembrance Day Ceremony:

The community is invited to join Branch 233 of the Royal Canadian Legion as they march east on Broadway from the Legion on John Street to the cenotaph behind the Town Hall. **The parade starts at the Legion at 10:30 a.m. and the service at the cenotaph in Alexandra Park is set for 11 a.m.** Information on the Legion is available at [www.rcl233.com/home.html](http://www.rcl233.com/home.html)
